The benefits of testing according to OECD Test Guidelines (TGs):

OECD TGs allow reliable and reproducible characterisation and prediction of possible effects to human health and the environment.

Data generated according to OECD TGs are internationally comparable for research and development as well as regulation.

Testing with OECD TG is one of the two pillars of the OECD Mutual Acceptance of Data.

Industry and government save costs as testing according to OECD TGs prevents multiple testing and many unnecessary animal tests.

International acceptance of test results reduces trade barriers and supports the competitiveness of industry.

OECD TGs facilitate safer and more sustainable innovation. Innovation is a key driver in overcoming the challenges that humanity encounters.

Appropriate up-to-date Test Guidelines are crucial for safety assessments for both innovators and regulators. Therefore, continuous political support and public funding is needed to keep Test Guidelines up-to-date.

The Malta Initiative advocates at the EU Commission for:

Continuous funding that addresses specifically the steps of validation and harmonisation/standardisation of test methods

A coordinated approach that considers synergies, multiplier effects and the exchange needed for successful Test Guideline development

An exchange **platform** for Test Guideline development

Legislation has to keep pace with innovative research developments for citizens to place trust in innovation.

Appropriate, clear and enforceable legislation is a key factor for long-term investments and innovation.

OECD Test Guidelines support innovation, reduce global trade barriers and make legislation enforceable.
